I am writing this page in August, so that it can get to everyone before the month of September begins. Last night, I watched the speech given by current president Joe Biden at the Democratic National Convention in Chicago. During COVID, it was determined that some employees were absolutely necessary for life to continue...and others could work from home or not work at all. I still contemplate this distinction. There is a part of me that believes that all workers are, and all work is "essential". This Labor Day, I hope to treat everyone as such... especially those who will be working on Labor Day, while the rest of us enjoy the last hurrah of Summer.

Because of the Auto Industry, Kenosha has been a "labor town" historically. We have had more than a few church members who have worked in the Auto Industry. I moved here after the Auto Industry had already disbanded here...but I believe that the effects of organized labor still live on.


Finally, I am remembering my dad on this Labor Day. He was the first vice president of the Correctional Officers' Union in the Wisconsin System of Corrections. The state tried to kill the union many times in its early years...but it survived until Governor Walker's administration. I remember attending secret meetings as a little girl at the ranch of Dick Jarvis—the union's first president. Little did I know that I was amid a small slice of history. Thanks, Dad, for providing a happy childhood for me; thanks to all of those who work so that all may enjoy life. As the author of Psalm 90 beseeches, may God "prosper the work of our hands."
