Last month, I received a letter from the Wisconsin Conference United Church of Christ office. I wanted to share parts of that letter with you, because it applies to the ministry that we have here at Somers UCC. It addresses the question about how small churches do ministry and mission in our current time and place. Here is a part of that letter:

Linda Kuhn and David King have retired from church consulting. But some years ago, while still running Sand Bur Consulting, they created a resource called "Smaller for a Purpose." The opening paragraph explored a common perception that "churches who fall below denominational or national averages (in membership, budget, worship, and church school attendance, pastoral salary) are something of a drain on the rest of the church. It was assumed these churches were smaller for a

reason—because something had gone wrong—and they were not growing." Kuhn and King suggested a different narrative. What if some churches are small for a purpose? "Healthy small churches have distinct advantages in this age of post Christendom," they wrote. "They can communicate rapidly and effectively; their relationships are deep and strong; they can be nimble in response to changing circumstances; they have a rich experience of trusting God to lead and support them in difficult times; they know and understand the resources (even if limited that God has placed at their disposal; they often have a history of strong lay leadership; and,

they tend to act without waiting for permission if the need requires." ...Many of our congregations in the Wisconsin Conference fit this description: Smaller for a purpose. If you are a member, lay leader or preacher in a church that worships 25 or fewer on average, this is an invitation exclusively for you. With the support of the Wisconsin Conference, a working group has been created to explore and share the experience of ministry in small congregations...I share my optimism and excitement for this gathering and hope you will join.

I have joined in the conversation with our sister churches in the Wisconsin Conference UCC that are Smaller for a Purpose...or as others have suggested—small, but mighty. I hope that we can continue to celebrate together the work that we do together. I hope that you will understand that we have not "failed" but are instead doing what God has put us here to do. Glory to the God of all things...big and small!


