This is the month that I turn 60. For many of you, 60 is in your rearview mirror, but I have been contemplating this milestone in my life for a while now as it approaches. In fact, it was last year that I read a book that helped me to think seriously about my life in its current state and about how the future may take shape. The book has an odd title, and I have told some of you about it already. The book is Hagitude:

Reimagining the Second Half of Life, and it is written by Sharon Blackie. Here is a question Blackie asks in that book:

"What would it mean, instead of being an elderly woman, to be an elder woman? Because to be an elder implies something rather different—it implies authority: "a leader" or "senior figure" in a tribe or other group, says Lexico. According to Merriam-Webster, a person "having authority by virtue of age and experience." The Cambridge Dictionary tells us it's "an older person, especially one with a respected position in society." So how do women transition from becoming elderly to becoming elder?"

I have been blessed in my days—especially my days as your pastor—to have had the mentoring of many incredible Elder Women. I have learned from many of you who are reading this what it means to be a woman who uses the authority that she has to make her life, and the lives of others, meaningful and beautiful. This has been one of the wondrous and unexpected gifts of ministering here. To me: to be an "elderly woman" is to be one who might fear what others will think or say if she speaks her mind and shares her insights. To be an "elder woman", though is to know that there are others who are waiting for you to speak your mind and to share your insights...because your mind has been enriched by paying careful attention to your life and your insights have come to fruition from years of walking with and watching over others.

November is also the month in the life of the church universal in which we celebrate the saints. All Saints Day is November 1st. I am surrounded by my own personal female cloud of witness: my mom, my grandmas, my great-aunts, and my seminary professors Marilyn and Peggy. In addition to these "elder stateswomen" in my cloud of witnesses, I remember my dear friend Kathryn as well. Kathryn would have turned 55 on the 8th of this month but died too soon at the age of 50. She was an "Elder stateswoman" in personality if not in actual age...and I miss her still, but feel her wisdom teaching me.
